The Department of Leadership, Technology and Human Development in the College of Education invites nominations and applications for the position of Assistant Professor of School Psychology. Georgia Southern University (www.georgiasouthern.edu), a member institution of the University System of Georgia and a Carnegie Doctoral/Research University, is one of Georgia's premier universities. A residential university serving 18,000 students in fall 2009, Georgia Southern is recognized for providing all of the benefits of a major university with the feeling of a much smaller college. Founded in 1906, the University offers more than 100 campus-based and online degree programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels through eight colleges. The nearly 700 acre park-like campus is located in Statesboro, a classic Main Street community near historic Savannah and Hilton Head Island.

Within this setting, the College of Education offers undergraduate and graduate programs to prepare students for work in public education, community agencies, and higher education. Degree programs include the Bachelor of Science in Education in four different majors, the Master of Education in nine different majors, the MAT in four different majors, the Education Specialist in four different majors, and the Doctorate of Education in two different majors. All degree programs are accredited by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (PSC), the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

Position Description. Reporting to the Chair of the Department of Leadership, Technology, and Human Development, the Assistant Professor of School Psychology is expected to teach courses in School Psychology, advise graduate students regarding course work and action research projects, provide university supervision for practicum and internship students, conduct scholarly research and publish, and provide service to the University, community, and profession. The position is a 9-month appointment, and the salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Required Qualifications:

- earned doctorate in School Psychology or a related area by August 1, 2010
- one year experience in school, clinical, or higher education setting (may be internship or pre-doctoral experience)
- eligibility for certification as a school psychologist in Georgia
- ability to offer graduate advisement, conduct scholarly research and publish, and carry out service to the University and profession
- ability to teach graduate courses on- and off-campus, work with diverse populations, and to use and model technology
- ability to communicate effectively with colleagues and candidates

Preferred Qualifications:

- higher education teaching, scholarship, and service experience
- experience as a school psychologist in public/private schools
- previous field supervision of school psychology internships
- service as a faculty member in a school psychology preparation program
- clinical experience with school age children
- teaching using distance education technology

- national certification as a school psychologist (NCSP)
- licensure as a psychologist in Georgia or as a psychologist or school psychologist in another state

Screening of applications begins November 1, 2009, and continues until the position is filled. The position starting date is August 1, 2010. A complete application consists of the following electronic documents: a letter addressing the qualifications cited above; a curriculum vitae; and the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses of at least three professional references. Other documentation may be requested. Georgia Southern University seeks to recruit individuals who are committed to working in diverse academic and professional communities.
