The Department of Leadership, Technology and Human Development in the College of Education invites nominations and applications for the position of Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology. Georgia Southern University (www.georgiasouthern.edu), a member institution of the University System of Georgia and a Carnegie Doctoral/Research University, is one of Georgia's premier universities. A residential university serving 18,000 students in fall 2009, Georgia Southern is recognized for providing all of the benefits of a major university with the feeling of a much smaller college. Founded in 1906, the University offers more than 100 campus-based and online degree programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels through eight colleges. The nearly 700 acre park-like campus is located in Statesboro, a classic Main Street community near historic Savannah and Hilton Head Island.

Within this setting, the College of Education offers undergraduate and graduate programs to prepare students for work in public education, community agencies, and higher education. Degree programs include the Bachelor of Science in Education in four different majors, the Master of Education in nine different majors, the MAT in four different majors, the Education Specialist in four different majors, and the Doctorate of Education in two different majors. All degree programs are accredited by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (PSC), the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

Position Description. Reporting to the Chair of the Department of Leadership, Technology, and Human Development, the Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology will be responsible for teaching online graduate and undergraduate courses, advising graduate students, conducting and publishing scholarly research, and providing service to Georgia Southern University and the profession. The position is a 9-month appointment, and the salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Required Qualifications:

Minimum requirements for appointment include an earned doctorate in Instructional Technology or a related area by August 1, 2010; knowledge of current hardware/software applications; the ability to teach graduate courses, teach online, offer graduate advisement, conduct scholarly research and publish, and carry out service to the University and profession. Effective communication skills, the ability to work with diverse student populations, and the ability to use and model technology are also required.

Preferred Qualifications:

Preferred experience includes K-12 teaching experience; school library media experience; higher education teaching; and teaching using interactive distance learning systems.

Screening of applications begins November 1, 2009, and continues until the position is filled. The position starting date is August 1, 2010. A complete application consists of the following electronic documents: a letter addressing the qualifications cited above; a curriculum vitae; and the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses of at least three professional references.
