The Department of Leadership, Technology, and Human Development in the College of Education invites nominations and applications for the position of Temporary Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology. Georgia Southern University, an institution of the University System of Georgia, and a Carnegie Doctoral/Research University, is the largest and most comprehensive center of higher education in the southern half of Georgia. A residential university serving 16,841 students in fall 2007, Georgia Southern's hallmark is a superior educational experience emphasizing academic distinction, excellent teaching, and student success. Founded in 1906, the University offers 118 degree programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels through eight colleges. The 675-acre campus is located in Statesboro, a Main Street community of approximately 30,000 residents, 50 miles northwest of historic Savannah, and 200 miles southeast of Atlanta.

Within this setting, the Department of Leadership, Technology, and Human Development (<http://coe.georgiasouthern.edu/lthd/>), one of three departments within the College of Education (<http://coe.georgiasouthern.edu/>), includes sixteen faculty in four distinct programs. The Program in Instructional Technology offers graduate degrees at the master's level. Graduate courses are offered in an online format.

**Position Description.** Reporting to the Chair of the Department of Leadership, Technology, and Human Development, the Temporary Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology will instruct graduate and/or undergraduate students in the use of technology in instruction. The position is a 9-month appointment, and the salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

**Required Qualifications:**

- Master's +30 or Educational Specialist degree,
- knowledge of current technology in instruction,
- the ability to teach graduate courses in an online format,
- the ability to teach undergraduate introductory technology courses in a face-to-face format,
- effective communication skills,
- the ability to work with diverse student populations, and
- the ability to use and model technology.

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- Doctorate in Instructional Technology or a related area by the date of appointment,
- K-12 teaching experience,
- school library media experience,
- higher education teaching experience, and
- experience teaching using interactive distance learning systems.

Screening of applications begins July 1, 2008 and continues until the position is filled. A complete application consists of the following **in electronic format**: a letter addressing the qualifications cited above; a curriculum vitae; and the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses of at least 3 professional references. Other documentation may be requested. Georgia Southern University seeks to recruit individuals who are committed to working in diverse academic and professional communities.
