The Department of Teaching and Learning in the College of Education invites nominations and applications for two positions as non-tenure track Instructors of Early Childhood Education. Georgia Southern University (www.georgiasouthern.edu), a member institution of the University System of Georgia and a Carnegie Doctoral/Research University, is one of Georgia's premier universities. A residential university serving 18,000 students in fall 2009, Georgia Southern is recognized for providing all of the benefits of a major university with the feeling of a much smaller college. Founded in 1906, the University offers more than 100 campus-based and online degree programs at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels through eight colleges. The nearly 700 acre park-like campus is located in Statesboro, a classic Main Street community near historic Savannah and Hilton Head Island.

Within this setting, the College of Education offers undergraduate and graduate programs to prepare students for work in public education, community agencies, and higher education. Degree programs include the Bachelor of Science in Education in four different majors, the Master of Education in nine different majors, the MAT in four different majors, the Education Specialist in four different majors, and the Doctorate of Education in two different majors. All degree programs are accredited by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (PSC), the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

Unless otherwise noted, all positions report to the Chair of the Department of Teaching and Learning, are 9-month appointments, and the salaries are competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience. Each of the Instructors is expected to collaborate with faculty in the Department of Teaching and Learning; use technology as part of instruction; supervise and assist with field experiences; and perform service to the department. One Instructor position is expected to supervise and assist with field experiences in early childhood education and teach courses in early childhood curriculum, as well as methods courses in elementary mathematics or social studies at the undergraduate level. The second Instructor position is expected to supervise and assist with field experiences in early childhood education and special education and teach courses in early childhood education and special education at the undergraduate level.

Required Qualifications:

- . M.Ed. or higher in Elementary Education, Curriculum and Instruction, or closely related field by August 1, 2010.
- . Must have a minimum of three years of successful teaching experience in grades K-8 or comparable teaching experience in an Early Childhood teacher preparation program at the university level.
- . Experience in using technology in instruction.

Preferred Qualifications:

- . Experience in teaching elementary school social studies or mathematics
- . Experience in university supervision of field experiences
- . Experience working with a diverse student body

Second Position—Search #56698

Required Qualifications:

- M.Ed. or higher in Elementary Education, Curriculum and Instruction, or closely related field by August 1, 2010.
- Must have a minimum of three years of successful teaching experience in grades K-8 or comparable teaching experience in an Early Childhood or Special Education teacher program at the university level.
- Academic preparation in Special Education at the Elementary School Level
- Experience in using technology in instruction.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience in university supervision of field experiences.
- Experience working with a diverse study body.

Screening of applications begins December 15, 2009, and continues until the positions are filled. The positions starting date is August 1, 2010. A complete application consists of a letter addressing the qualifications cited above; a curriculum vitae; and the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses of at least three professional references. Other documentation may be requested. Georgia Southern University seeks to recruit individuals who are committed to working in diverse academic and professional communities.
