### Are all courses online?

Yes, all of the courses required for a GOML program are online and must be taken online. There are no on-campus attendance requirements for the two GOML programs.

### What does it cost?

The e-tuition rate established by Georgia ONmyLINE is \$350 per credit hour. The cost per 3-credit hour course is \$1,050. No additional fees are charged by Georgia Southern University.

\$50 fee paid online by credit card (MasterCard, American Express or Discover) or electronic check drawn on a United States bank.

Summer 2009 - May 19

### How will I know I've been admitted?

Upon review of your application and determination that you meet the program admission requirements, you will be sent, by email, an acceptance notice and information on how to register for courses.

### Can GOML students start classes before being admitted?

No.

### When do GOML students register for classes?

GOML students receive information on how to register for courses in their acceptance email.

For Summer 2009 – Registration begins April 1.

For Fall 2009 – Registration begins July 1.

### When do classes start for 2009? Can a student begin their online classes early?

## What documents are required with the admissions application?

Admission for the GOML programs is handled as a **Quick Admit process** in which acceptance is based upon information supplied in the application. Upon review of your application and determination that you meet the program admission requirements, you will be sent, by email, an acceptance notice and information on how to register for courses.

While receipt of additional requirements (official transcripts, test scores, or other materials) may not prevent you from starting your program of study, you will be expected to supply any required information soon. **Any additional requirements are listed on the instructions for the online application for GOML programs.** Also, you will be told what is expected of you in your acceptance acknowledgement. *You will not be allowed to register for future terms if you fail to complete any additional requirements within the established timelines.*

## Are transcripts required?

Yes. Transcripts must be designated as official and sent directly from the institution(s) previously attended to the Office of Admissions. Transcripts marked "Issued to Student" will not be accepted. Applicants who have attended Georgia Southern University are not required to submit Georgia Southern transcripts.

## Are test scores (GRE, MAT, GACE) required?

- **M.Ed. in Accomplished Teaching**  
GRE or MAT scores are not required for applicants who hold a clear renewable certification in a teaching, service, or leadership field; instead the applicants must submit passing GACE or PRAXIS scores.
- **M.Ed. in Instructional Technology**
  - Students who hold a clear, renewable T-4 certificate are not required to submit GRE or MAT scores.
  - Students who do not possess a Level Four Certificate, are required to present an official report of scores on the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) or the verbal, quantitative and analytical writing sections of the Graduate Records Examination (GRE).
  - GACE or PRAXIS scores are not required for admission for the M.Ed. in Instructional Technology.

GRE or MAT test scores, if required, must be current, within the last five years, and sent directly from the testing agency to the Office of Admissions.
